Today's reading builds on the common, ancient Near Eastern metaphor of the king as shepherd. Judah's unjust rulers have caused their people, their "flock," to be scattered. Nevertheless, God will raise up a new and righteous shepherd who will rule a restored Judah.

A reading from Jeremiah,

¹Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the LORD. ²Therefore thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the LORD. ³Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply. ⁴I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall not fear any longer, or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing, says the LORD.

⁵The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land.

SECOND READING: Colossians 1:11-20

An early Christian hymn praises the mystery of the political, personal, and mystical Christ, the one who was present at creation and is eternally reigning with God.

¹¹May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully ¹²giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. ¹³He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

¹⁵He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; ¹⁶for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. ¹⁹For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

- ³⁹One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" ⁴⁰But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? ⁴¹And we indeed have been condemned justly,

for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." ⁴²Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." ⁴³He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."







Only a week until the Nancy Price Memorial Wreath Party

Bethlehem Lutheran Church - Fellowship Hall- Sunday, November 27th 1:00pm

Many years ago, Nancy Price began hosting wreath parties in her Cleveland basement. After moving to Pittsburgh, she brought the tradition to Bethlehem, where for decades, friends gathered to ring in the holiday season with Christmas tea, cookies, music and wreath making. Please join us to honor her memory and bring back this timeless tradition!

A few things to remember:

- The wreath party is informal-wear old clothes!
- Bring your own greens (see list of recommended nurseries if not cutting) Pieces should be at least eight inches long. Fill a laundry basket (packed) and keep outside to stay fresh.
- Frazier, Balsam, Douglas, and Scotch are the easiest pines to work with. Blue Spruce and White Pine are not recommended!
- Bring your own frames, wire and decorations (see list of recommended stores to purchase frames).

What should I bring? Greens - Wire Cutters - Rose clippers - Garden gloves - Decorations Frame(s) - Wire - Garbage bag for trash - A friend! - CHRISTMAS SPIRIT!!

Where should I buy pine? Glenshaw Feed - LMS Greenhouse & Nursery (Allison Park) McTighe's Nursery (Glenshaw) -- Overbeck's Nursery & Landscaping (Blawnox)

NOTE: One bale of greens or a small tree (approximately \$15) should make two 20" wreaths

Where should I buy frames? Michaels - Amazon - Dollar Tree (depends)
