WORD

FIRST READING Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

God promises a childless and doubting Abram that he will have a child, that his descendants will be as numerous as the stars, and that the land of Canaan will be their inheritance. Abram's trust in God is sealed with a covenant-making ceremony, a sign of God's promise.

A reading from Genesis,

¹ After these things the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." ² But Abram said, "O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" ³ And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." ⁴ But the word of the LORD came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." ⁵ He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." ⁶ And he believed the LORD, and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

⁷ Then he said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." ⁸ But he said, "O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" ⁹ He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." ¹⁰ He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other, but he did not cut the birds in two. ¹¹ And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.


¹⁷ Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us.





OUR LENTEN PRISON MINISTRY 2025



Matthew 25:36 I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in **prison** and you visited me.

Each week many prisoners are released from the Allegheny County Jail, a 2,766 bed facility in the heart of Pittsburgh. Many of these men and women were incarcerated wearing clothes that were not fit to keep. These members of the body of Christ will be released without decent clothes to wear home.

The prison chaplain has informed us that they are constantly in dire need of sweat pants and sweat shirts. The sweatpants for men are the greatest need. Since 2019 Bethlehem has collected 231 items during Lent. Your Health & Wellness team hopes that you will, once again, offer some help to our brothers and sisters in Christ by donating these NEW items during the weeks of Lent. Please place your new sweatpants or sweatshirts in the bins in the narthex.






ANNUAL EASTER EGG HUNT
